Danube Delta & Black Sea Coast Sat 5th - Sun 13th May 2012

Trip Diary

The Danube Delta and habitats along the western coast of the Black Sea showed again a very nice face to our small groups of participants. We designed this 9 day long holiday to visit the most important birding spots and leisurely explore the available characteristic bird species, focusing to local breeders and late spring migrants. This year was not an exception and we had a very successful trip again with 177 bird species observed!

Straight in the beginning, after the group arrived we soon enjoyed masses of birds around Calarasi's first class wetland sites, in the perfect afternoon light behind us! We had our first Little Bitterns, Spoonbills, Glossy Ibises, Purple Herons, all 4 Grebe species, all Marsh Terns here and the show continued with 100+ Ferruginous Ducks, mixed colonies of 300 Whiskered Terns with Black-necked Grebes and 2 separate colonies of Black-headed Gulls and Black-winged Stilts. What a good start! Early evening we arrived to our accommodation in Silistra, Bulgaria.

Next morning we did birding in the nearby park along the Danube, watching flocks of 40 Goldfinches while eating seeds of *Dandelion* flowers. Highlight was a Syrian Woodpecker perched in the open over our heads. After the breakfast we continued our journey to the Black Sea coast and birding in the morning mainly along the Danube Valley. First birds immediately appeared around Ostrov's vineyard such as newly arrived Red-backed Shrikes, European Bee-eaters, territorial Ortolan Bunting, two male Barred Warbler, a pair of Wryneck and a Black Kite. Next stop was in the vicinity of Buceag village where flooded fishponds along the Danube were full with birds. Here we saw 50+ Ruddy Shelduck, Garganeys, Wishkered Terns, a distant White-tailed Eagle and a feeding flock of Glossy Ibises.

We had lunch at Canaraua Fetei woodland where Red-rumped Swallows breed together with hundreds of Barn Swallows and House Martins. In this place we had the best view of a pale morph Booted Eagle while gliding over our heads. Early afternoon we reached Mamaia where we had time to check in to our rooms, than took a short visit to Navodari before the evening dinner.

During the next three days we mostly did birding around the Sinoe lagoons and steppe grasslands - agricultural fields of coastal Dobrudja. Highlights' here was hundreds of soaring White Pelicans, 7 Dalmatian Pelican, 3 Marsh Sandpipers, 80 Collared Pratincoles, 6 Little Terns, a single Red-breasted Flycatcher, breeding plumage Red-throated Pipits on migration, Pied Weathears, Paddyfiled Warblers, Calandra- and Greater Short-toed Larks, male Levant Sparrowhawk while hunting than eating a lizard 100 meter away from us, 80+ Red-footed Falcons, 2 imm. Pallid Harrier, an immature (3 cy) Eastern Imperial Eagle and a close, perched Saker Falcon!

Above Babadag forest Short-toed Eagles, Honey Buzzards and Long-legged Buzzards glide to North direction. In the woodland Icterine Warblers, Wood Warblers, Blackcaps sang without intermission.

Near Enisala fortress Short-toed Eagle, Long-legged Buzzard and more White Pelicans were the main attractions, than just after the lunch we arrived to Tulcea and started discovering the Delta's birdlife with our smaller boat. Due to the small size group, accommodation in the Danube Delta this time was in a 4 star pension in Mila 23 village and this necessary changes hasn't had any negative effect to our birding list or sense of comfort!

We had mostly sunny and warm days here, this means excellent conditions to find our targets. Every morning we start our daily program from Mila 23 village, than we return to our accommodation for lunch and dinner. Main destinations during these 4 days were the seashore near Sulina, a nice oak woodland near Letea village and lots of different lakes and channels north to the Sulina branch.

Higlights in the Delta part was 6 Great Black-headed/Palla's Gulls, hundreds of White Pelicans, Black -, Lesser Spotted-, Grey-headed Woodpeckers, singing Little Crake, Collared Flycatchers, singing Thrush Nightingales, White-winged Black Terns, a close Little Bittern, Red-rumped Swallows, Red-necked Grebes, Hobbies, Eastern Olivaceous Warbler and evening dinners on the terrace, in the sunset light:)

All in all, it was a very productive and enjoyable birding trip to southeastern Romania in this spring again!

Observed and heard in Calarasi –lezer wetland site.

Red-necked Grebe Podiceps grisegena

One Calarasi-lezer and 40+ in the Danube Delta.

Great Crested Grebe Podiceps cristatus

Over 100 ex seen during the week

Black-necked Grebe Podiceps nigricollis

8 Calarasi-lezer and 2 in the lagoons.

Black Stork Ciconia nigra

One in the Danube Delta

European White Stork Ciconia ciconia

Common and widespread.

Glossy Ibis Plegadis falcinellus

8 Calarasi-lezer, 26 Lake Buceag, 6 Vadu and 200+ in the Danube Delta

Eurasian Spoonbill Platalea leucorodia

6 Calarasi-lezer, 4 Lake Buceag, 40 Vadu and 12 in the Danube Delta.

Eurasian Bittern Botaurus stellaris

One heard only

Little Bittern Ixobrychus minutus

3 Calarasi-lezer and 1 in Danube Delta

Black-crowned Night Heron Nycticorax nycticorax

Seen every day and very common the Danube Delta.

Squacco Heron Ardeola ralloides

Seen every day and very common the Danube Delta.

Grey Heron Ardea cinerea

30+ seen during the trip

Purple Heron Ardea purpurea

8 Calarasi-lezer, 4 Buceag, 2 Vadu and common in the Danube Delta.

Great Egret Ardea alba

Seen every day and fairly common the Danube Delta.

Little Egret Egretta garzetta

Common and widespread.

Great White Pelican Pelecanus onocrotalus

Seen almost every day of the trip, 700+ over the lagoons and 1200 over the Danube Delta.

Dalmatian Pelican Pelecanus crispus

6 Vadu, one Histria, and at least 8 sightings in the Danube Delta.

Pygmy Cormorant Phalacrocorax pygmeus

13 Calarasi-lezer, 4 Lake Buceag and several hundred in the Danube Delta.

Great Cormorant Phalacrocorax carbo

Common.

Common Kestrel Falco tinnunculus

Widespread and fairly common.

Red-footed Falcon Falco vespertinus

20+ Histria, 60+ Vadu and 28 ex seen in the Danube Delta

Eurasian Hobby Falco subbuteo

1 over the lagoons and 14 in the Danube Delta.

Saker Falco cherrug

One adult female seen on a pylon near Nuntasi.

Peregrine Falcon Falco peregrinus

A huge female over Sinoe village, in the way to North

European Honey Buzzard Pernis apivorus

One Canaraua Fetii and another one over Babadag Forest

Black Kite Milvus migrans

One seen over Ostrov village on the 2nd day

White-tailed Eagle Haliaeetus albicilla

1 adult over Buceag Lake and 4 in the Danube Delta.

Eastern Imperial Eagle Aquila heliaca

A 3cy bird were seen on a pylon near Sinoe village. We sow it while hunting than a bit later glide to north direction

Short-toed Eagle Circaetus gallicus

One over Enisala fortress

Western Marsh Harrier Circus aeruginosus

Widespread and seen daily.

Pallid Harrier Circus macrourus

2 immature bird were seen over the agricultural fields of Dobrudja

Montagu's Harrier Circus pygargus

One female in the Danube Delta while we travel to Letea.

Levant Sparrowhawk Accipiter brevipes

One male were seen from 100 meter away along the Gura Dobrogei Valley, perched on a cliff side. Later start hunting and successfully caught and eaten a small lizard

Eurasian Sparrowhawk Accipiter nisus

1 over Babadag

Common Buzzard Buteo buteo

Several seen.

Long-legged Buzzard Buteo rufinus

2 Cheia Gorge, 2 Gura Dobrogei Valley on a nest, and 1 Enisala.

Booted Eagle Aquila pennata

One pale morph Canarana Fetei and 1 Cheia Gorge

Water Rail Rallus aquaticus

One heard in Danube Delta

Little Crake Porzana parva

One heard very close along the Magheru chanel/Danube Delta but didn't showed itself

Common Moorhen Gallinula chloropus

Several seen here and there.

Common Coot Fulica atra

Several seen here and there.

Common Crane Grus grus

A single bird seen over Navodari-Vadu in the way to north.

Black-winged Stilt Himantopus himantopus

A colony of at least 50 breeding pairs in Calarasi-lezer wetland site and 40+ in the lagoons, mainly at Vadu.

Pied Avocet Recurvirostra avosetta

40+ Vadu

Northern Lapwing Vanellus vanellus

Widespread and seen daily.

Grey Plover Pluvialis squatarola

1 Lake Buceag

Common Ringed Plover Charadrius hiaticula

1 Vadu

Little Ringed Plover Charadrius dubius

2 Vadu

Kentish Plover Charadrius alexandrinus

12 at Vadu

Green Sandpiper Tringa ochropus

One near Mila 23, Danube Delta

Wood Sandpiper Tringa glareola

20+ Vadu

Common Sandpiper Actitis hypoleucos

Small numbers here and there.

Little Stint Calidris minuta

120 at coastal wetlands.

Temminck's Stint Calidris temminckii

Two Vadu.

Curlew Sandpiper Calidris ferruginea

50 Vadu

Ruff Philomachus pugnax

Several seen at coastal wetlands and the Danube Delta.

Collared Pratincole Glareola pratincola

Eighty plus Vadu.

Black-headed Gull Larus ridibundus

Seen most days.

Great Black-headed Gull Larus ichthyaetus

A total of six seen, five adults all in summer plumage and 1 immature bird in the Delta.

Yellow-legged Gull Larus michahellis

Common and widespread.

Caspian Gull Larus cachinnans

Common in Danube Delta.

Little Tern Sternula albifrons

6 in Vadu

Whiskered Tern Chlidonias hybridus

Very common and seen daily.

Black Tern Chlidonias niger

Common and widespread, seen almost every day but less numerous than Whiskered Tern.

White-winged Black Tern Chlidonias leucopterus

10 at Calarasi-lezer and several in the Danube Delta.

Common Tern Sterna hirundo

Common on coastal wetlands and in the Danube Delta.

Feral Rock Dove Columba livia

Common.

Stock Dove Columba oenas

A few in the Danube Delta.

Common Wood Pigeon Columba palumbus

17 in the Danube Delta.

European Turtle Dove Streptopelia turtur

Seen in Letea forest

Eurasian Collared Dove Streptopelia decaocto

Widespread and common.

Common Cuckoo Cuculus canorus

Seen or heard every day.

Little Owl Athene noctua

A couple seen here and there.

Common Swift Apus apus

Common, widespread and seen daily.

European Roller Coracias garrulus

Most common in the Danube Delta where we saw total of 23 individual.

Common Kingfisher Alcedo atthis

13 in Danube Delta

European Bee-eater Merops apiaster

Seen virtually every day.

Common Hoopoe Upupa epops

Common and widespread on the coast and inland and also seen in the delta.

Wryneck Jynx torquilla

A pair seen along vinyards, near Ostrov

Lesser Spotted Woodpecker Dendrocopos minor

1 near Crisan, Danube Delta

Syrian Woodpecker Dendrocopos syriacus

A pair Ostrov, one Corbu

Great Spotted Woodpecker Dendrocopos major

A few seen mainly in Danube Delta

Black Woodpecker Dryocopus martius

A pair seen well in a poplar tree line in the Danube Delta.

Green Woodpecker Picus viridis

One heard at Canaraua Fetii

Grey-faced Woodpecker Picus canus

Five in Danube Delta.

Red-backed Shrike Lanius collurio

Seen mainly in Dobrudja with total of 37 individual

Lesser Grey Shrike Lanius minor

15 seen mainly in Dobrudja

Eurasian Golden Oriole Oriolus oriolus

Common and widespread.

Eurasian Jay Garrulus glandarius

A couple here and there.

Common Magpie Pica pica

Very common.

Eurasian Jackdaw Coloeus monedula

Widespread and common.

Rook Corvus frugilegus

Widespread and common.

Hooded Crow Corvus cornix

Widespread and common.

Marsh Tit Parus palustris

1 at Babadag Forest

Great Tit Parus major

Common.

Eurasian Blue Tit Cyanistes caeruleus

Common in the Danube Delta

Eurasian Penduline-tit Remiz pendulinus

Several seen in the Danube Delta.

Common Sand Martin Riparia riparia

Very common.

Barn Swallow Hirundo rustica

Common and widespread.

House Martin Delichon urbicum

Common.

Red-rumped Swallow Cecropis daurica

Ten Canarana Fetei and two Danube Delta.

Long-tailed Tit Aegithalos caudatus

A couple in the Danube Delta.

Calandra Lark Melanocorypha calandra

50+ in Dobrudja's steppe grasslands and agricultural fields.

Short-toed Lark Calandrella brachydactyla

3 near Sacele

Crested Lark Galerida cristata

Several coastal area.

Eurasian Skylark Alauda arvensis

Common and widespread.

Woodlark Lullula arborea

One heard near Enisala and one in Letea/ Danube Delta.

Savi's Warbler Locustella luscinioides

Frequently heard and occasionally seen.

Great Reed Warbler Acrocephalus arundinaceus

Common.

Sedge Warbler Acrocephalus schoenobaenus

One obliging bird near Mila 23/Danube Delta

Paddyfield Warbler Acrocephalus agricola

Half dozen Wolves Penisula and in Histria.

Eurasian Reed Warbler Acrocephalus scirpaceus

Common.

Eastern Oliveaceus Warbler Iduna pallida

One seen well near Mila 23, Danube Delta

Icterine Warbler Hippolais icterina

2 at Canaraua Fetii and one in Babadag Forest

Willow Warbler Phylloscopus trochilus

A few heard and seen.

Common Chiffchaff Phylloscopus collybita

A few heard and seen.

Wood Warbler Phylloscopus sibilatrix

One seen and several more singing in Babadag Forest

Blackcap Sylvia atricapilla

Common in drier woodlands.

One seen at Babadag Forest.

European Starling Sturnus vulgaris

Widespread and common.

Eurasian Blackbird Turdus merula

A few at Canaraua Fetei area

A few at Canaraua Fetei area

European Robin Erithacus rubecula

One heard near Ostrov

Thrush Nightingale Luscinia Iuscinia

Seen and heard in the Danube Delta.

Common Nightingale Luscinia megarhynchos

Several heard.

Black Redstart Phoenicurus ochruros

One at Mamaia

Common Redstart Phoenicurus phoenicurus

3 Vadu and commonly heard and frequently seen in the riparian woodlands of the delta.

Whinchat Saxicola rubetra

6 at the coastal area.

6 Histria, 10+ Gura Dobrogei Valley

Northern Wheatear Oenanthe oenanthe

Several in coastal areas.

Pied Wheatear Oenanthe pleschanka

1 male in Gura Dobrogei Valley, 5 different male at Cheia Gorge charst region, among them at least 1 hybrid with Eastern Black-eared Wheatear

Spotted Flycatcher Muscicapa striata

1 at Mamaia

Collared Flycatcher Ficedula albicollis

5 in the Danube delta.

Red-breasted Flycatcher Ficedula parva

1 at Mamaia Park.

House Sparrow Passer domesticus

Widespread and common.

Spanish Sparrow Passer hispaniolensis

Common

Eurasian Tree Sparrow Passer montanus

Common.

Yellow Wagtail Motacilla flava

Common in the lagoons area and among them many black headed 'feldegg' individual.

White Wagtail Motacilla alba

Several seen.

Tawny Pipit Anthus campestris

15+ at Gura Dobrogei Valley

Red-throated Pipit Anthus cervinus

13 at Wolves Penisula, some males had sang too

Chaffinch Fringilla coelebs

Small numbers here and there.

European Greenfinch Carduelis chloris

8 seen during the trip in different places.

European Goldfinch Carduelis carduelis

40+ in Silistra park and several more in the Danube Delta

Common Linnet Carduelis cannabina

2 Cheia gorge and 2 Gura Dobrogei Valley

Hawfinch Coccothraustes coccothraustes

At least 2 Canarana Fetei
